



Creative & Cultural Skills, November 2013

Pathways to Design examines the design industry's perceptions of young people, their suitability for work and the neccessary skills and abilities needed to thrive within the sector. It is the first major qunatitative study of design employer views on the education sector in the UK

Pathways to Design

 76% of design employers were happiest to employ graduates

- 58% felt that those graduates did not come with the skills they expected, citing:
 - Commercial awareness
 - Communication skills
 - Basic business & workplace skills



Pathways to Design

However...

- only 14% could claim to be 'very engaged' with education
- 25% felt that it wasn't their responsibility to engage
